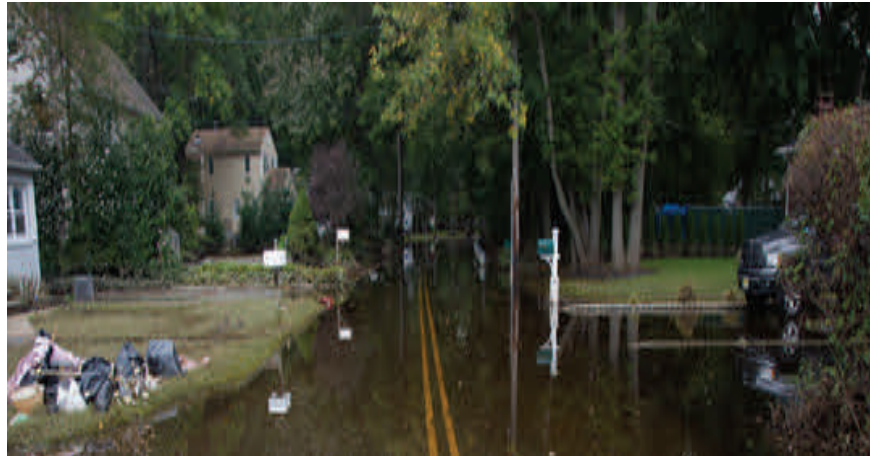


SPLASH ALERT!
