#### Leadership Essentials for the Water Industry Program Recognition

Applications are now open for three available 2025–26 cohorts of the ACWA JPIA Leadership Program. In response to growing demand for General Manager-specific development opportunities, a third General Manager-only cohort is planned in Costa Mesa next year, pending sufficient enrollment. Due to rising costs for meeting space, meals, and instruction—after several years without a tuition increase—member tuition will rise to \$2,495 (previously \$2,195). To help offset this increase, JPIA will continue offering the E.G. “Jerry” Gladbach Leadership Program grant to one participant per cohort and a \$400 tuition discount for members in the JPIA Liability Program. To ensure broad access, one participant per applying agency is typically accepted unless space permits additional attendees, and if seats remain after all member applications are processed, non-members may be admitted at a rate of \$2,625. JPIA General Managers and senior leadership team members are encouraged to apply early, as space is limited. The application deadline is June 16, 2025, and application materials, including program details and session schedules, are available at the JPIA website.

### Walter “Andy” Sells Commitment to Excellence in Water Safety Award Recognition

Ms. Flint introduced the new Walter “Andy” Sells Commitment to Excellence in Water Safety Award, named in honor of former JPIA CEO Walter “Andy” Sells, who retired in September 2023 after 33 years of service. In recognition of Mr. Sells’ dedication to reducing liability, property, and workers’ compensation losses across the JPIA membership, two agencies that exemplify the Commitment to Excellence (C2E) Program will be honored each year at the Spring Membership Summit. Awards will be given in two categories based on agency size: one for agencies with 29 or fewer employees, and one for agencies with 30 or more, with recipients selected based on accomplishments outlined in the Summit packet. This year’s winners are: Orchard Dale Water District and Stockton East Water District.

### ACWA JPIA Risk Pool Recognition

Mr. deBernardi shared that ACWA JPIA received three notable recognitions this year, reflecting its ongoing commitment to excellence and member service. At the 2025 AGRiP Governance Conference, JPIA earned AGRiP Recognition for meeting high standards in risk pooling best practices. JPIA also maintained its CAJPA Accreditation with Excellence following a 2025 triennial review, reaffirming its leadership in governance, finance, and member services. Additionally, the Finance Department received the GFOA Award for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the 11th consecutive year, recognizing continued transparency and strong financial stewardship.

## FINANCIAL

### Approval of the Audited Financial Statements for Year Ending September 30, 2024

Mr. deBernardi stated that each year, the JPIA provides for an independent audit of the JPIA’s financial statements. Gilbert CPAs performed the annual audit of the JPIA for fiscal year October 1, 2023, through September 30, 2024. The JPIA received an unmodified opinion that states that the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of ACWA JPIA as of September 30, 2024, and the results of its operations and cash flows for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. As in the previous year, the JPIA prepared an Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) in accordance with the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) standards. Management intends to submit this report to the GFOA for review in order to again obtain the Award for Excellence in Financial Reporting. Consequently, the Annual Report has additional reports therein to meet these high standards.

## Approval of the Proposed Operating Budget for Fiscal Year October 1, 2025-26

Mr. deBernardi noted that in March of each year, a proposed operating budget is submitted to the Finance & Audit Committee and then to the Executive Committee for review. Then, at the ACWA JPIA Spring Membership Summit, the proposed operating budget is presented for approval to the Board of Directors. The budget covers General & Administrative (G&A) Expenses for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026. The most significant changes to the G&A budget for the fiscal year are Staff Salaries, Staff Employee Benefits, and Computer Equipment Software, Office Furniture (lines 1, 2, and 9). The increase in Staff Salaries is primarily due to six new positions included in this budget that were not part of the previous one, bringing the total number of full-time positions to 65. Staff Employee Benefits have decreased, largely because no additional pension or OPEB costs are anticipated. The JPIA remains overfunded in both benefit areas. The budget for Computer Equipment, Software, and Office Furniture has increased by 37% compared to the current year. This is mainly attributed to the inclusion of new claims software and anticipated expenses related to the relocation to a new building. The overall increase in the Operating Budget is 7.3% (line 35). Salaries remain the largest line item in the budget.

## **PROGRAMS**

---

### Ancillary Programs Update

Ms. Jobe provided an overview of the ancillary coverages available through the Liability and Property Programs. JPIA currently offers a variety of ancillary programs, including Cyber Liability, Excess Crime, Dam Failure Liability, Public Officials Bond, Underground Storage Tank Pollution Liability, Fiduciary Liability, Difference in Conditions, Basic and Supplemental Life, Employee Assistance Program, and Disability. These programs are specifically designed to address a wide range of needs beyond JPIA's core pooled program, offering additional protection and helping members effectively manage and mitigate risks.

Ms. Jobe highlighted some of the ancillary coverages during her presentation. The Cyber Liability Program has 279 members and provides coverage from financial losses resulting from data breaches and other cyber events. The Excess Crime Policy provides insurance for 73 members and covers losses related to monetary crimes related to operations (such as theft and embezzlement) which exceed the limits of the primary pooled coverage. The Dam Failure Liability Policy provides insurance for 17 members and covers losses related to third-party bodily injury or property damage arising out of the partial or complete structural failure of any scheduled dam. Public Officials Bonds are purchased by 11 members and provides coverage for an agency's public official's failure to perform their duties faithfully and honestly. Lastly, the Underground Storage

Tank Pollution Liability Policy provides insurance for 10 members and covers losses for third-party claims arising from bodily injury and property damage caused by environmental incidents resulting from an underground storage tank. It also includes coverage for government mandated clean-up costs.

## **UPDATES**

---

### ACWA Update

Mr. Marwan Khalifa, ACWA Interim Executive Director, emphasized the strong and collaborative partnership between ACWA and JPIA in addressing members' needs. He recognized the dedication and contributions of staff members and provided an overview of ACWA's key accomplishments and initiatives over the past year.

### CEO Update

Ms. Beatty's CEO update highlighted two key areas: AI impact on JPIA operations and JPIA's Captive, CWIF. Both topics were presented to provide members with a deeper understanding of the overarching goals and operations of the ACWA JPIA.

JPIA designated AI Champions within its Leadership Team to ensure that it stays at the forefront of innovation. Exploring how AI can enhance JPIA operations, ensures staff can apply AI in ways that improve efficiency, strengthen risk analysis, and ultimately enhance the quality of service provided to members. Participation in national conversations—such as AGRiP's 2025 emphasis on AI—ensures that JPIA leadership remains well-versed in the latest developments and practical applications. This positions JPIA to anticipate changes in the risk environment, respond more effectively to member needs, and deliver smarter, more adaptive solutions to help members manage their risks.

At the Spring Summit, while JPIA does not hold a formal CWIF Board meeting, staff endeavors to provide the Board with an update on CWIF's financial status and other key developments. Ms. Beatty noted that CWIF was established to allow JPIA to invest in a way that better aligns with the long-term nature of insurance claim payouts, some of which may span 10 to over 30 years. She highlighted that because of CWIF's structure and strong capital, we can take a more flexible investment approach, aiming for better long-term returns in line with our investment policy and goals. Ms. Beatty noted that CWIF is currently achieving a rate of return just shy of its stated goal and that – in just five years of operation – CWIF has returned the JPIA almost \$19 million in paid dividends.

---

### Review Pending Lawsuits Directly Involving the JPIA

Mr. Greenfield reported that there is one pending lawsuit and one threatened lawsuit pending against the JPIA.

## **PRESIDENT'S UPDATE**

---

President McDonald congratulated the newly elected Executive Committee members and then highlighted the updated Summit content and structure during today's Board of Directors meeting, emphasizing its alignment with JPIA's mission to deliver valuable resources that meet the needs of its members.

President McDonald also announced the morning seminars scheduled for Tuesday, May 13, and recognized the Spring Summit sponsors. She extended an invitation to all attendees to join the JPIA reception immediately following the Board meeting.

President McDonald called for adjournment of the Board of Directors' meeting at 4:16 PM.
